



Project 11: Digital Spiritual Care.

Introduction

Spirituality is an important factor in health. As spiritual care providers encounter increasingly digital healthcare settings, how spirituality is understood, lived, cared for and indeed measured and documented, changes. In our project, we investigate ongoing developments, accompany emerging practices, and engage in knowledge transfer.

Overview of research foci

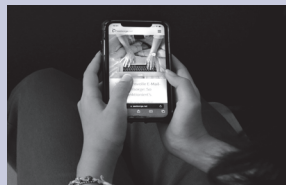
We have identified five core foci for research:



Focus 1: The digitalization of communication and interaction through clinical documentation in electronic medical records (EMRs)



Focus 2: Digital instruments for quality control (e.g. patient-reported outcome measures, PROMs)



Focus 3: Digital religious practices of patients (e.g. participating in online healing ceremonies and prayer-groups or spiritual exchange in online communities)



Focus 4: Digital forms of chaplaincy (telechaplaincy)



Focus 5: Digitalization of chaplaincy research and training

First research phase (2020-23)

In this first phase, we have emphasized foci 1, 4) and 5); the more complex focus on patient practice and satisfaction will be addressed more intensively in a later phase of the UFSP. The documentation focus continues lines of research from a previous project and is currently proving to be highly relevant in the Swiss context.

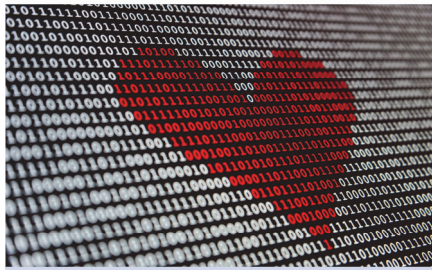
A conference held, on 19 January 2022, illustrates the cooperation with the professional association for pastoral care in this regard, cf. www.bsq-apa.ch/documentation/.

We work hermeneutically and empirically, involve key figures regarding digital transformations, and work closely with professional associations and other UFSP Digital Religion(s) projects (see e.g., Winiger at al, forthcoming).

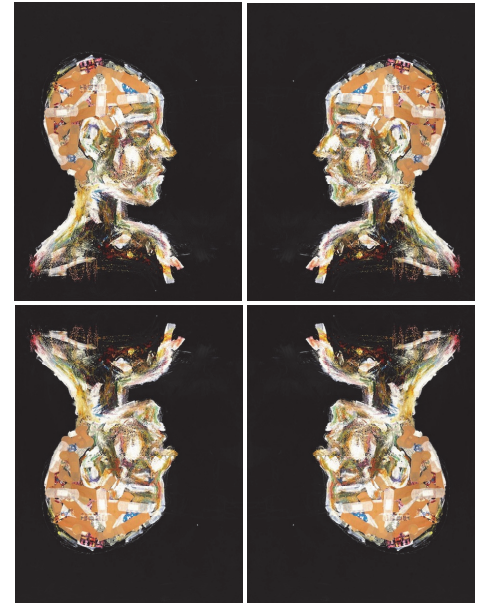

Next Steps

A virtual conference is currently underway with our U.S.-based partner Transforming Chaplaincy (see box on left). A conference is planned to be held in Zurich in September 2023 under the title «Digital Spiritual Care - quo vadis?», which will facilitate knowledge transfer from the U.S. to the Swiss context.

A special edition of the Journal «Spiritual Care» is planned for 2023 by Annette Haussmann, Simon Peng-Keller, Fabian Winiger and David Neuhold. In addition to theoretical reflections, it will feature interviews with telechaplains, historical protagonists in Digital Spiritual Care and leading actors in current praxis.
