





P10: Legal Rules and Regulatory Concepts for the Use of Information Technology in Ecclesiastical Law and the Law of the Relations between State and Church in Switzerland, Austria, and Germany

The project aims to explore the complex interplay between church, state and the digital realm. The main objectives of the project are to identify existing legal frameworks and regulatory approaches to the use of ICT by the Roman Catholic and Protestant churches in these countries.

It examines how the use of ICT in the church context is regulated by laws that define the relationship between church and state, and reviews the legal doctrines that justify these regulations and their development processes.

Furthermore, the project explores the conceptual foundations of "digital church action" and its impact on church identities and doctrines. It also examines societal perceptions of the church's role in the digital age, with the aim of uncovering expectations of church action during this transition.


Main Findings
